



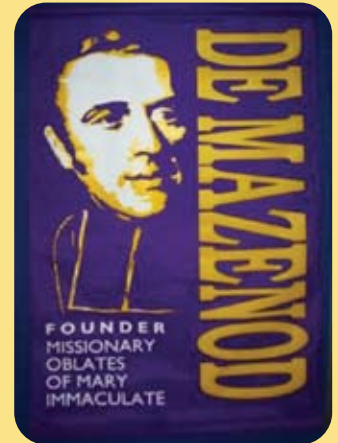

St Eugene de Mazenod and a few companions on 25th January 1816, the "Feast of the Conversion" of St Paul, formed a religious family to be known as THE MISSIONARY OBLATES OF MARY IMMACULATE.

Eugene wanted the Oblates to be passionate about bringing people to find their fulfilment in Christ. They must love the people they serve. Faced with the aftermath of the French Revolution they were to help restore the Church in France. Eventually they would also be called to help build the CHURCH 'in lands beyond their shores.' Today these Oblates, Priests and Brothers together with Lay Cooperators are in 67 countries.

In 1936 Spain was experiencing a Civil War which challenged the Christian foundations upon which their nation was built. On July 20, 1936, the socialist and communist youth took to the streets of Madrid and set about destroying churches and convents. In Pozuelo, a suburb of Madrid they attacked the chapel, parish church and the seminary of the OBLATES. Thirty eight Oblates were arrested. Twenty two of Oblates were taken and shot. They were killed because they were helping the local people grow in their relationship with Christ. Thousands of Priests, Brothers, Sisters and Lay people were killed throughout Spain. Many have been recognised as martyrs by the Church and many more will be. On 17th December 2011 the Church declared "Blessed" this group of twenty three of whom twenty two were Oblates. They are 'martyrs for the cause of Jesus Christ'. Eighteen of the twenty two were between 18-30 years old.

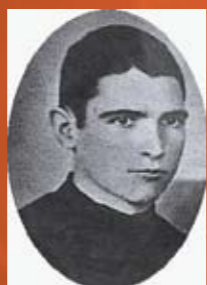

The Year of Faith

Pope Benedict frequently reminds us of the dangers to our civilization from those who promote the extremes of secularism and deny the role of religions, especially Christianity, in promoting human growth and fulfillment. For this reason he invites us to embrace the 'Year of Faith.'

"For her part, the Church ... in season and out of season, proclaims a Gospel which not only proposes unchanging moral truths but proposes them precisely as the key to human happiness and social prospering." Pope Benedict XVI

Speaking to the Australian Bishops during their recent visit to Rome, Pope Benedict said:

“It is urgent to ensure that all those entrusted to your care understand, embrace and propose their Catholic faith intelligently and willingly to others.”

“The great challenge for us is to become a more missionary Church,” said Archbishop Mark Coleridge of Canberra in a recent interview.

“Our parish communities have to become not just pastoral centers but evangelizing centers,” the Archbishop said, suggesting that now is not the time to “circle the wagons” but “roll the wagons out into new territory.”

Pope Benedict pointed Australian Catholics to Saint Mary MacKillop’s “courageous response” to the difficulties she faced and said it should inspire them “as they confront the new evangelization and serious challenges to the spread of the Gospel in society as a whole.”

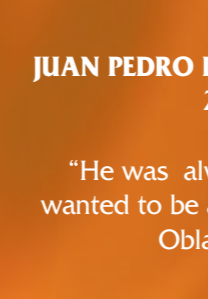
