## SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR B



Our Lady Help of Christians Nationwide Holy Rosary is happening again this year on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> May. It will be held in Churches across Australia from 2 - 4 pm.

This year our theme is Through Our Love of God, we can be the people that God wants us to be. By meditating on the Gospels in the Holy Rosary we can grow in God's ways of sacrificial love and service to others. God's love, renews our hearts, minds, souls, and spirits through his gifts. There are 20 virtues or gifts associated with the Holy Rosary, which are specific to each mystery. They provide the virtues which help us to be people of God, giving glory to Him, being of service to Him, and having joy, faith, hope, and courage. These gifts can enable us to do God's will, keep us on God's path, and trust in His mercy when we lose our way. For example, God's joy is the fruit of the 5<sup>th</sup> Joyful Mystery, Finding Jesus in the Temple. Just as Mary and Joseph became distressed when they lost Jesus, so too do we have anxieties when we are not close to Jesus. In contrast, when we feel the presence of Jesus in our lives, we experience the goodness, peace, joy, and strength of His love. You can't go to the shop and buy patience, courage or persistence, obedience, perseverance, or faith. These fruits, enhance our character, they are just some of the gifts that are freely available to us from God. Hence, praying the Rosary can help us overcome our trials, deepen our faith, connect with the Holy Trinity, and lead a more fulfilling life.

It was the Rosary that sustained the early Australian Catholic communities when they didn't have priests or weren't able to celebrate Mass publicly. By praying to Our Lady Help of Christians who has been the Patroness of Australia, since 1844 we will give thanks to our Blessed Mother Mary for this opportunity to come together, for her love and intercession in our lives. We will be praying for a strengthening of our Christian faith, peace, and justice in our families, our societies, our nation, and our world. Prayers for more priests, for those people who are suffering from war, famine, abuse, sickness, poverty, accidents, homelessness or environmental disasters. Also, prayers for some viable, long-term solutions to our problems will be offered.

When people from across Australia are united and praying together it gives more strength to our petitions and our praise to God. St. Louis Marie De Montfort wrote in his book "<u>The Secret of the Rosary</u>," that there are numerous benefits to praying the Rosary in a group, including receiving the merits of each person's Rosary.

We hope that some people and families who have not prayed the rosary for a while will take up this opportunity to join with their community in a show of solidarity and understand the need to pray for our Christian faith. If you are not able to make it to the Parish, you can pray in your home, preferably at the same time.

## First Reading Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

# The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

#### A reading from the first letter of St John.

#### God is love.

My dear people, let us love one another since love comes from God and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Anyone who fails to love can never have known God, because God is love. God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.

## Gospel Acclamation John 14:23

Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

### Gospel John 15:9-17

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

No one can have greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you, I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name. What I command you is to love one another.'
