SAINT OF THE WEEK ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM (347-407) - 13 SEPTEMBER

St. John, named Chrysostom (golden-mouthed) on account of his eloquence, came into the world of Christian parents, about the year 344, in the city of Antioch. His mother, at the age of 20, was a model of virtue. He studied rhetoric under Libanius, a pagan, the most famous orator of the age. In 374, he began to lead the life of an anchorite in the mountains near Antioch, but in 386 the poor state of his health forced him to return to Antioch, where he was ordained a priest. In 398, he was elevated to the See of Constantinople and became one of the greatest lights of the Church. But he had enemies in high places. His most powerful enemy, however, was the empress Eudoxia, who was offended by the apostolic freedom of his discourses. Several accusations were brought against him in a pseudo-council, and he was sent into exile. In the midst of his sufferings, like the apostle, St. Paul, whom he so greatly admired, he found the greatest peace and happiness. He had the consolation of knowing that the Pope remained his friend, and did for him what lay in his power. His enemies were not satisfied with the sufferings he had already endured, and they banished him still further, to Pythius, at the very extremity of the Empire. He died on his way there on 14 September 407.

"'Courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming,.......Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy" (Is 35:4-6)

My dear brothers and sisters,

In our day-to-day life, we all experience different impediments, either physical or spiritual, which deprive us of enjoying our life meaningfully. In today's Gospel Jesus heals the physical disabilities of a man. This miracle of the making the deaf hear and the dumb speak in gentile territory had an astonishing impact on the people. The gentiles were all surprised to see the divine power of Jesus and they praised him. This reaction of the gentiles remind us of the opposite picture of Nazareth where Jesus' own people did not accept him well. The spiritual deafness of the people of Nazareth saddened Jesus. They did not understand the transforming power of kindness and compassion.

Our spiritual deafness and muteness is worse than being physically deaf and dumb. The tragedy of the modern world is that we are often unable to speak to God in prayer and to hear God speak to us in the depths of our heart. Being his own people, we consciously tend to avoid Jesus and the life he wants us to live. We are so busy with our work that we fail to make some time for our own spiritual life. As Jesus took the deaf man aside in private to heal him, so we too need to go with Jesus in private so that he may heal us from our spiritual disabilities.

Let us reflect his weekend upon how open we are to listen to the voice of God. We all struggle at times with listening, and we especially may struggle to be alone with him. Let us spend some time alone with our Lord and let Him heal us so that you can hear and proclaim all that He is saying to us.
